He was predeceased by his first wife, the former May (Izzard) Upshaw; a son, John, two daughters, Vera (Mrs. Fred Shephard) and Dorothy Izzard; a stepbrother, John Izzard; a brother, William and two sisters, Sarah and Alice.

The body is in R. D. Linsay's Funeral Home, Halifax. Funeral will be 2 p.m. Thursday in the Cornwallis St. Baptist Church, Rev. W. P. Oliver officiating with burial in Oakridge memory Gardens, Lower Sackville.

BUF HOLDS ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (Taken from Joint Action News)

The 14th Annual Meeting of the Black United Front of Nova Scotia (BUF) was held June 18-19 in the town of Amherst. The meeting was presided over by the chairman of the Provincial Council, Mr. Clyde Bishop and was the first meeting attended by the newly-elected councillors following the bi-annual elections held in May.

The meeting which was attended by twenty-four of the possible forty-four councillors heard a hard hitting call from Mr. Bishop to councillors to fulfil their duties and responsibilities to the communities they represent. Mr. Bishop claims that many councillors over the years did not seriously accept and carry out their function. The net result of this, the chairman concluded, was an uninformed and ineffective Council. He called on Council to give its support to the chairperson so that that person can do the job they have been elected to do.

In his annual report to Council, the Executive Director, Mr. Haamid Rasheed, also called on Council to support their community leaders and work towards better and more meaningful corporations between organizations. The staff reports highlighted the organizations activities in community development areas in Yarmouth, Amherst, Glace Bay, and the Preston Area in corporation with the Lake Major Joint Action Committee. In the Human Resource Services Sector, Council was as usual overwhelmed with the many and varied activities and services provided to the communities.

The Black Awareness Programme was of special interest to Council due to the uncertainty of the funding for this excellent programme which is geared towards the needs of the youth in the Halifax-Dartmouth Area.
