



NOVA SCOTIA HOME FOR COLOURED CHILDREN, RESIDENTS AND COMMUNITY CONTACT

A summer project sponsored by the NSHCC (Nova Scotia Home for Coloured Children) and funded by CEIC employs four students to work on recreation for residents

Rev. W.R. States was born at Wolfville, N.S. in 1877. Orphaned at the age of 9 years, he was raised by his maternal grandparents in Kingsport. Wellington left home and stowed away on a ship sailing from Kingsport when he was 14 years of age.


Some time later, he returned to Nova Scotia and lived with his father's people in Mount Denson. His grandmother encouraged him to enter the ministry and he began his studies at Horton Academy.

In 1898, while working in Halifax, Wellington States took fellowship with the Cornwallis Street Baptist Church and received his license to preach there. In the same year, he worked at Granville Ferry and Inglewood. He was ordained in the Inglewood Church in 1899.

He moved to New Glasgow in 1906, and lived there for 13 years. He took up residence in Dartmouth in 1919 where he attended Victoria Road Baptist Church.

Wellington States died in 1927. A monument now stands over the site where he was buried.
