## RELIGIOUS NOTE:

AFRICAN UNITED BAPTIST ASSOCIATION, AUGUST 20 - 22.

Delegates and hundreds of visitors will be convening at Cornwallis St, Baptist Church, Halifax, August 20-22 for the 130th sessions of the African United Baptist Association of Nova Scotia.

The delegates will represent churches and societies from across the province where churches and association are located. It is considered the most representative of Black gatherings in the province and visitors from across Canada and the United States visit at that time to attend the sessions.

Each year it is held in a different location and reflects the missionary zeal of Father Richard Preston and others who convened the first gathering at Granville Mountain in 1854.

Many of the churches that were founded by Preston and the church have long been the strength and solidifying influence amongst the Black people of this province.

The Association is a part of the Atlantic Baptist Convention and prides itself in this Baptist heritage. Over the years it has not only been a religious body but also championed the cause of Black people in other areas of human experience. Many social educational and community improvements have come about through the Association.

The theme of this year's gathering is "A Time Of Renewal". The moderator presiding at the sessions will be deacon Churchill Smith.

Reports on the interests of the Association, the Convention, the Churches will be presented at the Saturday sessions. Devotional periods will be conducted by Licentiate Glen Gray, David Sparks, Deacon Gary Lopes and Sister Jeanette Johnson. The moderator's report and mayor's welcome will precede the youth rally Saturday night.

Sunday services will be held at the Queen Elizabeth High School. Preachers will be Dr. W. P. Clayton, Reverend MacPherson Eaton and Donald Thomas.

On Monday business will be conducted. In the afternoon the annual women's service and the closing service will be held at the high school. Deaconess Bessie Sparks will address the women and Reverend D. D. Skeir will preach at the closing session.

Choirs participating will come from Lucasville, North Preston, Cherry Brook, East Preston and Halifax.
