The South Korean Boeing 474 jumbo jet, commercial airliner, was supposedly mistaken for a RS-135 American reconnaissance plane, claimed the Soviets'. However the difference in the plane size and nose shape is considerably different and impossible, with all the modern equipment of today, to have been mistaken. The U.S. claim that their RC-135 spy plane was more than 1500 kilometers away to the North-east from the area where the United States says the South Korean Airliner was brought down by the Soviet Air-to-Air missile. The RC-135 which flies along the Soviet borders on the Pacific Ocean, is packed with sophisticated equipment to monitor Soviet radars, particularly Russian Air Defences, and the comparison between the planes are very unsimilar. We hope and pray that a peaceful settlement will be resolved throughout the talks of this most unfortunate incident.
