## Interview with Mr. Fichard (Dick) Hamilton Jr.

A high percentage were self taught or learned from others who were easier to teach. Jobs were hard to find, food wes hard to find, well food wasn"t hard to find if you had the money to buy it. The weather back in thoce days was always bad, if it wasn't snowing and blowng. it was raining in order to cut trees you would have to $u$ it off foup feet from the base, then haul it out mo aleigh.

Feople couldn't afford coel ae tree cuteme was a must. Ta Survive a winter familiss wuld phed fueherries ctanherras in the summer and make preserver stock ple wood get your sat fiah meat and potatoes inn have you Tlour fom making bread thon ytil you were mot ready for mirter"

Chm istmas Eve was we last time you want to toum bewarab the road: were be bed you could"t more Snow wes se deer it would come te the top of telephone poles. At though Mr" Bishop"s fam provided work for a few peonde we used thas as a last pesort for work beceuse wut et Greenhead foed which wes run by Gegrge Carmichael.

Eecchville once started at the ald Frospect Foad, which begins areund Ohain Lake and ended dit by Nine Mile River. Beemvile began to shorten when Mr. Cox upened his store and wanted his store in Laveside, so he (Mm. Cox) had a apetition taken around and Eeechville became Lakeside. Then cane the Industrial Fark which deesn't employee many people from Eeechville. Now the city wante another part of Eeectivile. It seems a long hard strugge for Beechville and getting harder. Through has work and determinationg Eeechvide will survive.

rather Burton had Eared for their religious needs until his death and Fev. Freston fourd them eager to have their own church. He worked with them until his deeth in ibsl. Fev. Eailey served in Eeech Hill in the late 1870 s and \(00^{\circ} \mathrm{s}\).
