There were some stormy sessions according to all reports, for racing was something new in the lives of the fishermen. It was beautiful to watch, and many people followed the course from start to finish. Shores om either side of the harbor were line d with people. Curiously enough, no builder has ever been able to duplicate the Bluenose.
