

DR. HELEN CREIGHTON COLLECTION:
WAX CYLINDERS:

PAWS HAS 4 WAX DICTAPHONE CYLINDERS. EACH CYLINDER HAS AN INDEX - BUT THESE WERE MIXED UP AT ONE TIME + DO NOT ACCURATELY IDENTIFY THE ITEM. SEPERATE IDENTIFICATION IS EXTANT - BUT WITHOUT A SOUND REPORT, THESE NOTES CANNOT BE CHECKED. TWO CYLINDERS ARE IN GOOD CONDITION. ONE IS CRACKED IN SEVERAL PLACES AND ONE IS SHATTERED.

ON NATIONAL MUSEUM TAPE 121 B (1953) HELEN HAS TWO OF THE CYLINDERS RECORDED. SHE BELIEVES SHE MADE THESE DUPLICATIONS HERSELF, THEY WERE DEFINATELY NOT DUBBED AT CRAWLEY FILMS. (PHONE CONVERSATION AUGUST 26/87)

IN 1930, SHE HAD A BORROWED CYLINDER RECORDING DEVICE FROM THE NATIONAL MUSEUM. IN 1938 SHE RENTED A DICTAPHONE MACHINE IN HALIFAX. THE TEXTS INCLUDED IN THE ACCOMPANYING MATERIAL FOR NATIONAL MUSEUM TAPE 121 B, STATES THE MATERIAL AS BEING RECORDED IN 1930.

THEREFORE, IT APPEARS THAT 1930 RECORDINGS ARE EXTANT. RECORDINGS MADE IN 1938 (SEPT. + OCT.) ARE NOT EXTANT. DR. CREIGHTON HAS NO IDEA WHERE THEY MIGHT BE.
