It was thought that Adam Biswanger came to Nova Scotia to escape involment in war, but it was actually the opposite. He conscripted into the army at the age of 18 and was sent over to the British soil as a German Soldier of the 60'th Regiment on Foot. The Regiment was like a British army and Foreign Legion combined. He received his land grant from the Canadian army at Milford Heaven and area in the early years for his service

The census of 1871 shows their residence as Stormont, John might have been buried there. His daughter Eva and Winthrop Cook are also buried there

Acadian Recorder, January 11, 1873.

“Death of John A. Beiswhanger on Christmas Day (1872). Had been married 66 years to Sarah Ann Pace and they were the oldest living couple in Nova Scotia. Mr. John Adam Beiswhanger was born on the Rhine in 1779. When 18 (1797), conscripted into the army. Later volunteered in the 60'th Rifles and came to Nova Scotia, securing his discharge here. In 1808, he married Miss Pace of Halifax, daughter of an Empire Loyalist, Darius Pace and had 9 children scattered from Nova Scotia to California

They were exiled for life, literally pushed onto boats with just their clothes on their backs to Nova Scotia.

Adam had moved to Fisherman's Harbour where he was a fisherman and died there. But he was buried in Stormount County Harbour beside his father John Adam and mother Sarah. Betsy passed away in 1936. Betty was was born in 1846, daughter of Willia

The 1871 census lists Adam as belonging to the Church of England, of German descent and a fisherman. Elizabeth passed away in 1846 at the age of 99 and is buried at Fisherman's Harbour.

Martha Ann was the first child of Adam and Elizabeth Biswanger. She married Ebenezer (Zeba) Hines, a fisherman. Witnesses: William and Phoebe Bingley .Zeba was born on February 16, 1863. Zeba's father, Frank Hines lived with them and also their nephew, Grant Gunn who was born on September 2, 1896.

Martha A. Hines died on November 12, 1952. She was 86 years, 9 mo and 1 day. She is buried at Fisherman's Harbour.

4-2-1 - Fisherman's Harbour lost one of its oldest citizens in the death of Mrs. Martha Ann Hines, in her 87'th year. She was born in Country Harbour, the daughter of the late Adam and Elizabeth Beiswanger, and came to Fisherman's Harbour in her younger days. She was a member of the Baptist Church in that community, until it was made over as a Community Church.

Survived are her husband, Zeba Hines, 89; one daughter Bessie (Mrs. Henry Archibald) with whom she resided; an adopted daughter, Marion (Mrs. William Thomas) and an adopted son, Frank Gunn and one grandson. Also surviving are two sisters, Mary E. Hines, Stellarton and Elvada Beiswanger, Fisherman's Harbour; and two brothers, George and Campbell Beiswanger, Saskatchewan. The funeral service was held from her home with Rev. C.W. Parry, assisted by Rev. George S. Mallory, officiating. Internment in Community Cemetery, Fisherman's Harbour

The second and only surviving child of Zeba and Martha Hines, she would've been raised as an only child, but her parents had taken the responsibility of raising her two "sibling cousins", Frank Gunn and Marion (Bingley) Thomas. As a young woman she spent time with her sister, Marion in Boston and then returned to Nova Scotia to work locally. Her employers enjoyed her sense of humour at Henry McLane's guest house, Stillwater, Grant MacDonald's Store, Sherbrooke, the Acapayeffs & Goldings in Sonora. While there, she met Henry Archibald and they were married in 1932 moving to Fisherman's Harbour in '33. Henry passed away in 1969.

While visiting relative in Massachusetts at the age of 63, Bessie married on February 12, 1972 to Adelard D. Walkover, a 74 year old widower of Main St., Wales by the Rev. David C. Williams. Adelard was born in Southbridge, MASS to Francois and Eliza Cote Walkover. After Adelard's passing in 1983, Bessie moved back to Dartmouth, NS. She was gifted in many ways and particular in sewing, knitting, crocheting which she continued even after moving to the Nursing Home. Her memory was sharp and was knowledgeable in local history and families, she was a valuable resource to those seeking genealogical information. She was also a woman of faith who regularly worshipped with the folks at the "Little Church at the Lake."

Bessie passed away on July 31, 2011 at the age of 102 years of age in Sherbrooke, Nova Scotia. Internment at Riverside cemetery, Sherbrooke, NS.

pg 7 - 4-2-2 - **George William Bieswanger** passed away in North Battleford, Saskatchewan. He had been in failing health for some time and had been a patient in hospital at Swift Current Sask for two weeks when his death occurred June 28,1952.

The deceased was born in Country Harbour, Guysborough County, son of the late Adam and Elizabeth Beiswanger. He would have been 86 in September. He was married twice. He married on April 7, 1890 to 18 year old Theresa Kaizer at the Church of England, Fisherman's Harbour. Witnesses: Thomas and Laura Keizer. Theresa's parents were Nathaniel and Sarah Keizer.

His second wife, who predeceased him five years ago, was the former Maude MacLean of Stillwater. He has resided in the Canadian West for over forty years and was a carpenter by trade. Survived by his brother, Campbell of Swift Current, Sask, and 3 sisters Mary Hines, Effie Miller of Providence R.I and Miss Elvade Beiswanger, Fisherman's Harbour. Predeceased by 3 brothers, Edward, John, Theodore and 1 sister Martha (Zeba) Hines. Interred North Battleford.

Hugh was the son of Adam and Elizabeth Biswanger in 1884 in Fisherman's Harbour, Halifax, NS. He married Mabel LuLu Griffen on June 13, 1912 in New Glasgow, Pictou, NS. LuLu was born in 1882. They lived at 47 Union Street in Halifax where Hugh worked as a carpenter. They were all at home at that fateful day of December 6 of 1917 in the north side of Halifax where the devastation was most prominent from the explosion. They were found in the house. Hugh was only 32 years of age. Their sons were only two and an infant. Hugh's father-in-law TH Giffin claimed and transported the remains to Goldboro. The cemetery marker says only Hugh and the unofficial lists says Lulu and Hugh, but the death certificates state that Kenneth and Everett are also buried at Goldboro. It is assumed that all four are buried at one site.

He married Nancy Biswanger, daughter of Nathan W and Nancy E Danvers of Cambridge, US. She died on April 25, 1880 at the age of 39 of Cest Embro.

At the age of 31, he married on September 3, 1867 to 24 year old Lucy Fanning by the Rev. James Buckley. The ceremony took place at Guysborough County, NS. Witness: George Luddington and the Rev. Both John and his father-in-law are listed as fisherman of Coddles Harbour. Joseph and Jane Buswhanger are listed as his parents and Joseph is listed as a farmer.

Margaret Ellen was born in 1831 to Samuel and Sarah Warner Soles in Halifax County, NS. When a widow, she died on May 29, 1909 at Westchester, MASS at the age of 78 years.

William Carswell was born on December 22, 1784 to William and Sarah Carswell in London, England. He entered an apprenticeship under James Hastwell as a Glass Cutter. (Might have been the spouse of his cousin, Mary Nash Hastwell.) His apprenticeship started on August 5, 1799 at St. Botolph's, Aldergate and ended abruptly after his father's passing. "He used him in the most shameful manner - ill treating him and almost starving him. " On June 27, 1811 it was decided by his brothers Thomas and John that William, who never married, was to have the houses and agreed that from Mid's that he should receive rents and pay the expenses. The estate was to furnish butts, pipes, chocks, etc. His other property listed was #5 Princes Street, Drury Lane. It is believed that he had the "Freedom of the City of London" from birth which he would've inherited from his father a possible member of the Worshipful Company of Drapers. His grandfather's right would've more likely had been passed to William's Uncle John, the eldest son of "Old John".

The following year, through his insurance records, his registered residence was #3 Bottle Hay Yard, St. John Street. On December 23, 1814 his brother John, ordered a copper plate of Austin for William (watch) papers to represent a figure holding a watch and scales and on a bank crowned with bushes. Carswell watch & Clockmaker, Perry's Court, Ipswich - for 2 guineas and 100 cards and 200 papers. This suggests that William after switching apprenticeships is now a watch clock maker and moving to Ipswich with John. There is no finished date for his glass cutting indenture. Edward Lawson, John's mentor lived at 58 Bishopsgate house until 1821 so William would've been closely in touch with him. He is mentioned often in his brothers diaries of visits and sending apples to his brother John. William was 49 years of age when John left for Canada.

On September 7, 1821 Lawson moved out of #58 Bishopsgate house, taking his watches and remains of stock at the same time William moved in with a Glass Cutter, Edward Young, wife Harriett and their family at #2 Hart Street, Cripplegate. He lived with the Young family for 20 years until his death about September 11, 1840 at the age of 55 years. In his will described again as a Glass Cutter, he leaves everything including the properties of 4/5 Princes Street to the Young family. He is buried at the Bunshill Fields, London.

Note: Bunshill Fields is located on City Road, Islington. It was primarily but not exclusively a cemetery for Non-conformists: Christians who didn't belong to the Church of England. His neighbours would have included John Bunyan, Daniel Defoe and William Blake. This cemetery was known by Poet Robert Wouthey as "the Campo Santa (Holy Field) of the Dissenters."

Thomas was born on January 23, 1786 to William and Sarah Carswell, the second surviving son. Thomas married Mary Whitaker on August 26, 1810 at St. Mary's, Lambeth, Surrey, London, England. Mary was born about 1795. They raised seven children at #13 Half Moon Street, Picadilly, in the parish of St. George, Hanover square. They must've had a large home as they had room for their family, up to five lodgers and possibly the bakery too. At the Guildhall Library, there is a record of insurance by Thomas at 13 Half Moon Street and also another at Stanton Herts. Thomas died on December 20, 1833 at his home the age of 47 years. His estate was probated on January 18, 1834 in London, England. This must've been a very difficult time for his brother John who left for Canada two months before. Mary continued as a single owner of 13 Half Moon Street, baker and no other properties are listed. She is also recorded in London's Central Criminal Court records :

In 1804, at the age of 14, John was apprenticed to a Watchmaker named John Edward Lawson, Bishopgates Street. London. The sum of 20 pounds is shown beside the entry. After 15 years apprenticeship, John Carswell was declared a "Freeman of the Worshipful Company of Clockmaker" on June 7, 1819.

Settling in York, John established a Watchmaker shop at 196 King Street in premises which he rented from a Dr. Gwynne. By 1837, John Carswell was known as a "silversmith" and distributor of "Camphene Oil". After leaving Toronto in 1844, John lived in the Prince Albert area of Teach County for 36 years. When he died November 9, 1880 he was described as a "Gentleman" which broadly meant he supported himself with no signs of working. He died of "decay of nature", (old age) at the age of 90 years.

At Prince Albert on Tuesday, 9th instant, Mr. John Carswell, aged 90 years and 8 months. How few of the many millions who started life with deceased in 1790 are now alive. Few indeed ! Deceased was born in London, England, March 8, 1790. He remained in his native land 'til 1834 when he, with the loving partner of his fie moved to Canada to take up residence in Toronto where he remained some twelve years before moving to Reach taking up residence two miles south of Prince Albert where he remained 2 years and moved into the village where he remained until his decease.

His own upright and unobtrusive manner, the amiable partner of his life and their exemplary offspring secured for the family the well merited respect of the whole community. He, with the devoted partner of his life pressed onward, hand in hand with their faces zionward for 60 years together, and as they approached nearer and nearer the brink of the rolling flood which divides the heavenly land from ours, they were by no means indifferent to the many indications of their coming change. When his partner was snatched from his embrace, he bowed in submission and kept in the even tenor of his way along the might river, 'til he too was summoned over. His was a calm and peaceful life, his voice was not heard in the streets, but in the beautiful language of the poet, " They also serve who stand and wait." He had a family of twelve children, seven of whom survive him.



David was born on February 22, 1831 at Ware, England. He was christened on August 18, 1833 at Old Meeting, Dead Lane-Independent, Ware, Hertforshire, England. He married in 1857 to Mary Taylor. There was a David Carswell listed in the Oshawa directory as a painter and glazier. They had one daughter, Charlotte.

David died at the age of 36 years on July 1, 1869 at Aspinwell, New Granada, now called Colon, Panama. His permanent residence was stated as the township of Reach, which is Prince Albert, Ontario, Canada.

The will was dated 4th November 1868 when David was 35 years of age. His father John and mother Sarah were named as executors and trustees on behalf of Charlotte.

The will itself was very simple. All of his estate to be realized, invested and held in trust until Charlotte's majority. If she should die before then the estate falls to John and Sarah or their successors. There is NO mention of his wife Mary so presumably they had parted company before the will was written.

John Carswell applied to the court for probate 18th February 1870 and at the same time Sarah renounced her position as executrix.

Mary was born on February 25, 1838 at Toronto, Ontario. She married George Francis (Frank) Marsh on October 21, 1856 in Port Perry Ontario. Frank was born on March 16, 1836 at Richmond Hill, Ontario.

Mary and Frank Marsh had eight children , losing three in infancy. While living in Huntsville, Mary was active in the local community. She served for 18 years as the President of the St. Andrews Presbyterian Church Ladies Aid Society. She was a strong shoulder for Captain Marsh to lean on during the hard years they encountered in building up the Huntsville Navigation Company. She was also an artist, at least one of her paintings, a landscape of the shoreline on Lake of Bays, near Dwight Ontario, would seem to indicate she had received some form of training.

In 1874, Captain Marsh moved to Baysville where he operated a wharf and storehouse which backed unto a river that runs into the Lake of Bays. Their \$1200.00 brick two-storey house on Main Street, Huntsville, "The Maples" on a large lot is still standing at today's value of 159.000 in 2001. The "Burnt Island" a 12 acre property, just north of Baysville, bought by the Captain in his early sailing days was valued in 1904 at \$30.00 After his steamboat business, a special charter was obtained during Frank's presidency and the Huntsville & Lake of Bays Railway Company was formed. It's mandate was to build and operate a railway that would connect Huntsville and Lake of Bays known as the "Portage Railway", nicknamed the "*Portage Flyer*." Two coaches were built and two Porter engineers were acquired from the E.B. Eddy Company. The engines puffed along at 4 miles per hour to terminals at North and South Portage were called "*Hot Tamales*." This provided a crucial 1.8 kilometre link connection steamboats on Peninsula Lake of Lake of Bays and opened up North Muskoka to tourism and increased development. A narrow-gauge train fondly named the "*Portage Flyer*" plied the steep grade between the lakes carrying mail, tanbark and tourists for 55 years. A commiserative plaque to Captain George Francis Marsh's dream of the "The World's Shortest Railway" was erected by the Ontario Heritage Trust at South Portage on August 21, 2007.

After this was accomplished, he placed a line of boats in the local water and from that time forward has been the leading spirit in navigation matters in the northern district. He has been a man of more than ordinary pluck and perseverance. When battling with the uphill difficulties of pioneer days, fire destroyed his best craft and at a later date two more of his boats were destroyed without insurance. But with indomitable courage he set to work to overcome his misfortunes and soon all three boats were replaced with new and more modern craft.

Four years ago, increasing age and responsibility urged him to seek some relief from the arduous duties of managing the entire operation and a joint stock company was formed with Capt. Marsh as President.

He did not relax his efforts however, and within a few months was seeking to accomplish a long held ambition - a rail connection between Peninsula Lake and Lake of Bays. He succeeded and had the satisfaction, a few months before his death of seeing the last spike driven. The "Portage Railway" enabled his company to carry passengers and freight on through tickets from Huntsville to Lake of Bays destinations.

His pride in the undertaking may be understood by the fact that a few weeks ago, after his return from treatment in the United States and when it was felt ultimate recovery was not possible, he asked to be taken one last time over the route from Huntsville to Lake of Bays and returned evidently satisfied that his life's works was done.

In politics Capt. Marsh was a strong Reformer and his interest in politics was always manifested. His voice was not infrequently heard at party conventions and only his refusal to the proposal prevented his name from being more prominently associated with politics. In religion he was a Presbyterian.

Captain George Marsh passed away from cancer at the age of 66 years on November 21, 1904 in Huntsville, Ontario. Due to Massive convulsions leading to heart failure, Mary died four years later in May 28,1908, Huntsville at the age of 71 years.

Three Red Deer area couples who celebrated a combined 180 years of marriage this weekend offered advice on staying together.

"Oh, just grin and bear it," joked Wynn Biswanger, 87, who married Evelyn in December 1938.

But Evelyn, 82, said it's a little more complicated.

"I don't think people today realize what they're getting into. They don't take it seriously."

Wynn, his brother Lawrence and their sister Kitt, who grew up in the Rocky Mountain House area, married within a year of each other.

During a family reunion this weekend, at an acreage west of Red Deer, they celebrated their 60-year anniversaries with a wedding cake and the retelling of memories.

Getting married during the Great Depression meant no fancy rings and elaborate wedding celebrations.

"I paid \$2.50 for her ring. She wore it for 50 years," said Wynn.

Evelyn said she can't wear the gold band anymore because it's become so thin. She still cherishes it as a keepsake.

"My engagement ring was \$10. We really splurged," said Marie Biswanger who married Lawrence at a camp at Sylvan Lake in July 1939.

At one time, all three couples worked at the same sawmill. In the evenings, they played cards together.

"We did anything to make a living," said Marie, who believes the problem with married couples today is they want to take but not give.

Between them, the couples have 17 children, 63 grandchildren and 58 great grandchildren.

"In the '60s, that is outstanding," said Bernice Southman, a niece of the long-lasting couples.







Mr. John Adam Beiswhanger was born on the Rhine in 1779. When 18 (1797), conscripted into the army. Later volunteered in the 60th

Rifles and came to Nova Scotia, securing his discharge here.

250 years ago, during the French and Indian Wars, a British General Braddock let his red coats in their formations through the forests south of today's city of Pittsburgh to attack Fort Duquesne. They marched right into an ambush, planned and carried out by a seemingly invisible enemy of French and Indians. Braddock himself was mortally wounded and as he lay dying, he said, "We shall learn to do it better next time."

The significance of his defeat was quickly recognized in England. Old fashioned field regulations were not up to new battle field conditions. With the help of three professional soldiers from Switzerland, the British army raised a new regular regiment employing new tactics. They would combine the marksmanship and skills of frontier scouts with the discipline of trained soldiers to create a new breed of fight men; they were later known in France as Chasseurs; in Germany they became Jaegers; and in the UK and Canada, they were called "Riflemen".

This famous regiment created on December 24, 1755, as the 62nd and renumbered the 60th in 1757 by the Earl of Loudoun. It combined the functions of a Colonial Corps with that of a Foreign Legion and in consequence a special Act of Parliament had to be passed, authorizing the Crown to grant commissions to foreigners in it, to serve in America only.

By 1787 foreigners could legally enlist into the 60 Foot without express authority under the Act of Parliament. At the end of 1797 - the year in which the Duke of York became colonel in-chief it was decided to increase the forces in America and another Act of Parliament (38 Geo. III, c. 13) was passed authorizing the Crown "to augment his Majesty's 60 Regiment of Infantry with the addition of a 5th Battalion, "to serve in America only and to consist of foreigners.

(This might've been when our John Adam Biswanger came to America)

This battalion, the first green-coated rifle battalion in the Army was organized under the command of Lieut-Colonel Baron de Rottenburg of Hompesch's Corps. It was formed of 17 officers and 300 men from Hompesch's Chasseurs and were dressed in bottle-grey cut-away coats with scarlet facings, white waistcoats, blue pantaloons, with black leather helmets and black belts.

Private 5th Rifle Battalion, 60th foot, c. 1797-1802. this battalion was really a German unit within the British infantry, having been formed in December 1797 on Barbadoe largely with men from Loewenstein's Chasseurs and Fusillers. It was the first battalion on the British establishment to be armed with rifles, a weapon familiar to many of it's initially German soldiers.

It's uniform was quite distinct in color and style from the standard red coat and bicorn; a green coatee with scarlet colour, pointed cuffs and piping, black and scarlet padded wings and pewter buttons; medium blue tight pantaloons, black half-gaiters edged with red; a black shako with white metal bugle horn badge and green plume; black accoutrements, brass belt plate.

They were the first to be equipped with a rifled weapon, they could march at 140 to the minute, deploying quickly and silently. Because they fought widely dispersed to the front and the flanks of the main body of the army, the Riflemen were admired and encouraged for their initiative and creativity. The regiment emphasized shooting, adaptability, initiative and was maintained as the Regiment's evolved through the 60 (Royal American) Regiment of Foot. In 1797, it's 5th Battalion became the first British official Rifle Corps dressed in green. (Fr the Queen's Own Rifles of Canada Regimental Museum and Archives)

That if hereafter, there shall not appear any lawful Let or Impediment, by reason of Consanguinity, Affinity, or any other lawful means whatever, but that the said

John Adams Beesewanger and *Sarah Pace* may lawfully solemnize Marriage together, and in the same afterwards to remain and continue for Man and Wife, according to the Law in that behalf provided.

And if the same Marriage shall be openly solemnized according to the Form of the Book of Common Prayer now established, and if the above bounden *J. A. Beesewanger*

& Francis Muncy do save harmless the said *Sir John* and other his officers whatsoever by reason of the Premises, then this Obligation to be void, or else to remain in full Force and Virtue.

On December 6, 1917 at 8:45 am Halifax was holding a time bomb in her harbour. The SS Mont-Blanc, a French cargo ship fully loaded with wartime explosives was involved in a collision with the Norwegian vessel SS Imo in the Narrows, a strait connecting the upper Halifax harbour to Bedford Basin.

About 20 minutes later a fire on the French ship ignited her explosive cargo causing a cataclysmic explosion that devastated the Richmond District of Halifax. The explosion literally blew the Mont Blanc to pieces, heaving the Imo onto the Dartmouth shore and leveled the north end of the city. The 2400 metric tons of high explosives was equivalent to the force of roughly 2.9 kilotons of TNT and killed about 2,000 people and nearly 9,000 injured. At 47 Union St., Edward, Mabel and their two boys were at home getting ready for the day in the worst hit area from the explosion.

A pressure wave of air - snapped trees, bent iron rails, demolished buildings, grounded vessels and carried fragments of the Mont-Blanc for kilometres. A tsunami created by the blast wiped out the physical community of Mi'kmaq First Nations that had lived in the Tuft's Cove area for generations.

Twenty thousand people were destitute and homeless. The Halifax newspaper listed the names of those who were in the hospital and the Halifax Relief Commission listed those who were identified at the morgue. Because the explosion affected so many persons, one way to find relatives of survivors is to note any unusual names in these records and call persons with names in the current phone book. There were 4 persons named Beiswanger killed in the explosion.

The family, Edward Hugh, Mabel, Kenneth and Allister Beiswanger are buried at the Goldboro cemetery.

Reminders of the event still mark the city, which commemorates the anniversary every year. Boston, the first city to come to Halifax's aid, receives a Nova Scotian Christmas tree each year.

Argyle: Guysborough County,

Aspen, Guysborough County, settlement located one mile south of South River lake near Antogonish/Guysborough county line in eastern NS. James was born in England in 1615. He married Elizabeth Rowland in 1639 at Stratford, Fairfield, Connecticut and they had seven children. He was a statesman and a baker of no small importance. He also owned a small farm. Between 1656 and 1660 he and his wife moved from Milford to New London, Connecticut where they joined the church in New London and were prominent in Church affairs. He was chosen by his townpeople to fill many important positions in church and state, proving strongly his high character and intelligence and the esteem in which he was held in the community. Up to when he retired in 1666 he carried business by far the most extensive foreign and domestic trade of any man in New London. His real estate holdings were very large. He owned several acres of land in Great Neck. This was one of the first grants of land within the Mohegan reservations. After being prominent in the community for years, James Rogers became one of his son John's early converts and a member of the church which John was a pastor. James and his wife were baptized into their son's church in 1676. For this offense they were summoned before the magistrate. Throughout the rest of his life he was subjected to fines and imprisonment for non-confirmity to the rules of the established church. Being a man of unimpeachable integrity and adhering redidly to his convictions of right and duty, regardless of sacrifice, he transmitted these traits of character to his children and they in turn to their descendants. James died in February of 1687 in Waterford, New London, Connecticut.

9-2 Rev John Rogers

John was born December 1, 1648 to James and Elizabeth Rogers. John and his wife were zealous members of the Congregation Church (under the "Halfway Covenant") until in 1674 when he was converted and studied the Bible with great earnestness. He came to the conclusion that certain doctrine and customs of the Congregational Church had no scriptural origin. He was baptized by immersion late in 1674 and was soon after received into the Seventh Day Adventist Church of New Port, Rhode Island. His wife first agreed with him and then opposed him and got a divorce on grounds on something he had done before they married. In 1675, John became a pastor of the Baptist Church. Believing that according to scriptures, Christians were answerable to God alone and be guided by His word as revealed in the New Testament and paid no attention to the Ecclesial Laws. As a consequence they were heavily fined, imprisoned and otherwise punished. He was fined for baptism by immersion. Conscientious and resolute opposition to the Union and State was the characteristic of this sect and was continued for a hundred years until that Union was practically dissolved. He wrote many books of able character. He possessed a superior literary talent. He also had a large land estate which he disposed of most during his lifetime as gifts. He died October 17, 1721 in New London, Connecticut.

8 – Thomas Pushee (Pouchey)

The Pushie heritage were Huguenots, the Calvinist Protestants of France and they fled from France to America after the St. Bartholomew Day massacre in 1572 to escape religious persecution. This Thomas may have been Gabriel's father. He was born about 1675 and immigrated to New Brunswick from France. There is no information on his spouse yet. He died in 1745 at the age of 70 years.

7 - Gabriel Pushee

Gabriel Pushee was born in 1706, probably colonial born as a French refugee from Nova Scotia or Cape Breton. The surname is thought to have originated in Belgium, France. He married Sarah Williams on July 26, 1726 in Ipswich, MASS. Sarah was born on May 19, 1703 in Manchester, Essex, MA. They raised five daughters and three sons in a modest house.

John was the youngest son born on August 15, 1748 in Ipswich, Essex, MASS to Gabriel and Sarah Pushee.

John married Lucy daughter of James Blodgett and Abigail Keys on November 20, 1770. She was christened on December 28, 1755 in Westford, Middlesex, MASS. They had seven children.

John enlisted in J. Minot's Company in the Malitia about 1775 as a war soldier.

Lucy passed away on May 23, 1811 in Westford, Middlesex, MASS. John died on June 13, 1834 in Ipswich, MASS.

Petition

The settlement of Ipswich was delayed due to the French Indian war. Finally on January 29, 1752 decisive steps were take when the proprietors voted one hundred pounds "old tenor" (equivalent of about \$54.00) to each of the first ten men who should build a house and settle a family. Land was of little value in this remote place; may of the first proprietors are known to have sold their lots " for a mug of flip." From March 10, 1752 to April 23, 1752 ten settlements were established. From this time on, new families continued to arrive, one of them Gabriel Pouchey.

At this time a feeling of apprehension and constant fear pervaded the new settlement. As a precaution against Indian attacks, several "block" houses made from hewn logs were occupied as garrisons. Two were like regular forts situated throughout the township. The anxiety of the people is vividly shown in a petition sent in the spring of 1755 to the government of Massachusetts pleading for relief and protection:

Petition of Ipswich Canada

To his Excellency William Shirley, Esp., Captain General and Governor-in-Chief in and over his Majesty's Province of the Massachusetts Bay; to the Honourable, his Majesty's Council and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled. The Petition of the Inhabitants of the place called Ipswich, Canada, in the County of Worcester, Humbly Sherbet, that there are Eight families of us now

living on the said plantation, which is at Least Eighteen miles from Lunenburg, the nearest place that is settled, or that can possibly afford us any help in case of an attack by the Indian Enemy which we are in daily fear of and altho the proprietors of said plantation did in October last build two Good and Sufficient fort, yet we being poor and but new Beginning in a very thick wooden Country and have all our provisions to buy and to bring from Lunenburg, Lancaster or Groton, and whereby it becomes Impossible for us to maintain our families and keep the forts, unless we are Protected must of Necessity Leave the place and go off, which we are Exceedingly unwilling to do and Give Ground to the Enemy, having Laid out all the Small Substance we had here and have no where to Go for Refuge if we must Leave our Crops now on the Ground, we and our familys will be finally undone. We are Sensible that Indians are about us for we hear them Shoot Especially on the Twenty Eighth of May we heard no Less than Seven Guns Shot in the Woods above us. We Scouted the next Day but Made No Discovery. We are all Shut up in the forts and know not how Soon we shall be Beset or Destroyed.

Therefore Your Petitioner Humbly Pray your Excellency and Honours would take our Distressed Case into your Wise and Compassionate Consideration and Grant us Relief and protection as in your Great Wisdom and Goodness Shall Seem Meet and your Petitioners as in Duty Bound shall Ever Pray.

There is no recorded evidence that the earnest petition was answered. That it was not unheeded is indicated by the reported testimony of an aged man who lived during the time the history of this report was published, that there were a few soldiers who were for a time stationed at Winchendon. It is likely they were here for the purpose of protecting the settlers from the Indians. Gradually peace came to the stricken settlement without a drop of blood shed between them.

In 1740 Gabriel and his family lived in Lunenburg, Worchester County, where in 1748-50. He was appointed "hogge reeve". In 1752 he moved a few miles distant to Winchedon.

In the beginning there were only six women residents in the town, but calm came to Winchendon and thirteen families arrived from 1755 to 1761. Progress and growth started to show. The first child born was Mary Holt on November 15, 1763 and Nathan Pushey (Pouchey) was the first male child born in the new settlement in October of 1758. Three years later, the first meeting house was built and Rev Daniel Stimpson became the first settled minister.

Lumber was the first industry in the colonies, it wasn't long before an effort was made to construct a saw mill in this new settlement with the encouragement from the proprietors to give each person one hundred acres of land "with the stream" for encouragement. This was accomplished in 1756.

The main staple of those days were boiled pork, potatoes, baked & boiled beans, barley and corn. Milk, brown bread, johnny cake and hasty pudding were also fare at the table. An anecdote is told of Mrs. Pouchey by a Dr. Manning. He had given her, "when she was young" a cake of chocolate with the directions to prepare it for him against his return to dinner. Being unwilling to acknowledge her ignorance of the article, she came to the conclusion that it was to be boiled with the pork and potatoes. After some time exploring the dinner pot with a fork to see if the cake was done, she was astonished at it's disappearance.

When the women weren't preparing the meals or domestic work, they gathered the crops, raked hay, pulled and spread flax and in most cases spun, wove, dyed and sewed the clothes for the family. The homespun clothes were very durable. The men wore tow shirts, striped woollen frocks and leather aprons; the best suit of coarse woollen were reserved for Sundays and special occasions and lasted for years giving little concern about the changing fashions. In 1759, a grist mill was built and deemed as a great acquisition to the new settlement as it saved the people from having to cart their grain to other towns for grinding.

In the year of 1764 through courage, perseverance and hard labour, many of the material features of the town had been accomplished. The spirited pioneers began to have a feeling of security and permanence. As a result, they petitioned the General Court of Massachusetts for the right to incorporate with all town privileges. Eleven years later in 1775, Gabriel died during the Revolutionary War and his widow, Sarah lived for many years after his death.

7-1 Ruth Pushee

Ruth was born about 1727 and was the first child of Gabriel and Richard Day and Abel Wilder were considered the leading men of the town in both church and government. Although Richard Day came here from Ipswich to Winchendon, he is believed to have been a native of Ireland. It is believed that at one time he owned one-third of the township. Day built the best house in town in 1752 on the high ground and was used for a while as a public house. Richard Day also built a log house tavern by the west orchard. Day met an untimely death in 1774 when he was killed by a falling tree, a casualty which was not uncommon in the early days of the town.

6 - Nathan Pushee Sr.

Nathan was the first son born to Gabriel and Sarah Pushee on January 16, 1732 in Ipswich. His baptism was on June 16, 1732. He was also the first male baby born in Ipswich and for this reason he received a plot of land from the proprietors when he reached the age of twenty one.

Nathan Pushee Sr. married Elizabeth Priest of Stow, in Lunenburg on January 13, 1757 and they lived in Winchendon, MASS. Elizabeth was born on June 23, 1734 in Stow, Middlesex, MASS. There is a record of two children, Nathan Jr. and David.

In 1759 he enlisted as soldier in the French and Indian War in Lancaster, a nearby town. He died in Winchendon in 1776 during the Revolutionary war and here is entended service in the Revolution credit to Nathan Pushee. The greater part was by Nathan Pushee and perhaps this Nathan, the father rendered some of the early service.

His sons, Nathan and David enlisted as soldiers in the Revolutionary War and BOTH were at Bunker Hill.

This is the record of David Pushe. He was born in 1760. He was a soldier in the Revolution and a pensioner. He married May 30, 1781 to Susannah Pierce. Susannah was born about 1763. They lived in Fitzwilliams and in 1787/88 to Lynne, both towns in the sate of New Hampshire. Their homestead was on the east part of the town. They had eight children, Nathan, David, Susannah, Abraham, Lucy, Jonas, Polly and Harvey. David and Susannah's sons were enlisted soldiers in the late war (civil war).

His wife, Susannah died on September 4, 1830. David passed away just over ten years later on September 21, 1840. Many of their children were gifted musicians.

5 - Captain Nathan Pushee

Captain Nathan Pushee was of French descent through his grandfather, Gabriel Pouchey (Pushey). He was born on June 13, 1758 to George Pushie and Margaret (Jane) Brown at Lunenburg, MASS.

At the outbreak of the American Revolution in April, 1775 Nathan Pushee enlisted as a private in Captain Phineas Company of Colonel Thomas Garner's Massachusetts Battalion and took part in the battle of Bunker Hill at the age of seventeen with only two months experience. It was a technical defeat for the rebels, but psychologically, it was a rebel victory.

Nathan had joined the society of his time in an environment of deep resentment against the restrictive trade and tax policies against the colonies. When he bore arms to throw off this heavy yoke his was a Spartan life in which he would've known physical hardship and danger. Their army moved inferior arms, ammunition and equipment by ship, horse or shank's mare against to the British Royal mastery Navy. When they marched, their ammunition was black powder, carried in a cow's horn and box of lead bullets which each man made his own by pouring lead made molten over an open fire into a mould. A musket was slow to load from a powder horn especially in battle and if their pre-prepared paper cartridges became damp, they were useless to ram down the musket barrel.

They had to prepare their own meals and carry their cast iron cooking pots. The route of an army could be traced by abandoned cooking pots. Many times to sustain his horse and himself, Nathan was driven to the necessity to scrounge local food sources.

That year on June 17 of 1775 the colony of Massachusetts had mobilized the first of 87,907 men of whom 67,907 served in the Continental Army and 20,000 in the Militia. To deny Boston to the British, the hills were fortified as part of the defences of Charleston.

Nathan was part of a rebel success that the British learned as their officers had supposed, were not an undisciplined, cowardly rabble.

What was the French Indian War?

The War fires were being stired in 1753 by the British and the French which swept the Americans and the Natives into the conflict. It started with the British objective to capture the French Fort Duquesne in 1753 by military force led by Brigadier-General John Forbes. George Washington was a 21 year old Major in the British Colonial Army. The French claimed the land by right of first discovery. The British claimed they had been granted the land by treaty with the Iroquois. There was a race to take the Ohio River Forks by both sides. The British army arrived first but not large enough to defend the fort from the French. Ensign de Jumonville was executed by one of Washington Indian guides which marked the formal beginning of the French Indian War.

General Braddock, Supreme Commander send his aide, Colonel George Washington to strike back at the vital river junction on May 29, 1755 with 2,100 men of the 44'th & 48'th regiment. The French and Indian (including Ottawa Chief, Pontiac) surprised the British and the battle became (known as Braddock's Defeat.)

Colonel Washington stayed calm even after being shot out of two horses, he took charge at the age of 23 as the Commander-In-Chief of the Virginia regiment.

By 1758, the British launched another attack on Fort Duquesne to gain control of the forks under General Forbes, General Washington successfully outnumbered the French and regained ground which became Pittsburgh.

News Flash from the Acadian Recorder of Halifax

In the year of 1758 there were two important historical events coming together :

George Washington held the position of chief command of the Virginia consigent in the ill-conducted campaign under General Forbes against the French at Fort Duquesne in 1758. Nathan Pushee Sr. had enlisted as a soldier and was there. Circumstances of Nathan's bravery would effect his son Nathan Pushee Jr.'s journey in life.

George Washington, was saved from being killed in the attack at Ticonderoga by the bravery of one of his soldiers named **Nathan Pushee**. Washington held his saviour in great esteem ever after and on resuming command of the Revolutionary Army in 1775, Washington chose **Nathan Pushee Jr**, as one of his bodyguards.

A paragraph went the rounds of the United States press, at this period, to the effect there were not more than two or three at the most of General Washington's Life Guards in the land of the living, perhaps the only one, an old gentleman who then lived in Great Britain.

*There turned out at least to be another, **Nathan Pushee**, a hale and hearty old chap who is living in Antigonish in this province...*

In the year of 1776, Nathan's father, **Nathan Sr** who had fought with Colonel Washington in the French Indian War passed away.

In March of 1776, **Nathan Jr** was transferred to the Life Guard protecting General George Washington, the Commander of the Continental Army. The following January, he re-enlisted in the 3rd Continental Light Dragoons and was promoted to trumpet-major, a rank comparable to a Pipe-major indicates that prior to military service he had at least a rudimentary knowledge of music and talent. With this unit he was engaged in the battles of Brandywine, Paoli, Germantown and Monmouth.

On September 11, 1777 British spies disclosed the position of 1500 Americans including Pushie and the Baylor's Dragoons. Nathan was one of the few to escape but 74 Americans were taken prisoner.

A year later on September 27, 1778 the Dragoons were positioned to check 3,000 British on the Hudson River's west side. The British under General Grey attacked again at nightfall. Thirty six of the defenceless men were bayoneted and forty more captured including his wounded Col. Baylor; only thirty seven escaped, including Nathan Pushie.

Re-enlisting again in December of 1779, Pushee became trumpet-major in Washington's Light Dragoons and moved to the southern theatre. The Dragoons wore blue coats faced and lined with white. The headpiece was a leather helmet, ornated with a fox tail, bear fur, horsehair or ribbons. They wore knee boots and spurs. Armed with a sabre, pistols, a short-barrel musket known as a carbine and with his trumpet, on for and horseback Pushee like his colleagues would have cut a dashing figure. As a trumpeter he would've road immediately behind the formation commander, at whose order he would sound the calls which directed the men. He also had miscellaneous duties on a part time assignment on Baylor's unit to be entrusted with the protection of General George Washington. They were nicknamed "Mrs. Washington's Guards" as they served as patrols, cidettes, couriers and escorts for Washington and his staff. The commander of the regiment was William Washington a second cousin of George Washington, who was well respected with well trained troopers "a cavalry outfit that sheer dash". William Washington was a fearless man in the field, a good tactician, a prime quality of a bold cavalry leader. When the British were in Charleston, the American sought to harass them and Tarleton's cavalry was driven back by Washington's Dragoons. The Dragoons set up camp for the night in three barns. On the early morning of April 14, 1780 Tarleton had his revenge charging into the American camp. Nathan's luck had run out this time, he was captured alive, unwounded, but a prisoner of the British at Monck's Corner.

Taken to Charleston, S.C., Nathan and more than 500 comrades faced almost certain death from disease and poor food in British prisons and in order to escape this fate they agreed to enlist in the British army provided they did not have to fight their fellow Americans. Nathan Pushee joined the Duke of Cumberland's Regiment, a provincial unit and was sent to Jamaica, where he became a sergeant in Captain Fideon White's company. Here Nathan Pushee met Zephaniah Williams who had enlisted with the First Maryland Brigade. Therein Jamaica, they spent three years together.

By the Treaty of Paris in 1783 the Unites States gained their independence but those who had served in British regiments could not return to the United States because they were excluded from the terms of amnesty. You can imagine the irony of these men who re-enlisted again and again into the American war effort and were banished. The commander of Nathan's regiment, Lord Charles Greville Montagu arranged for those men who wished land to be taken to Nova Scotia. The Regiment disbanded on August 24, 1783 and about three hundred personnel with their commander sailed on two transports, the Argo and the Industry. They arrived at Halifax on December 13, 1783 which must've been a severe shock from the balmy Jamaican climate to the frigid cold to the bone winter. Lord Montague shared his men's hardships, dwelling with one small group in huts five miles from the city. From his record a good man who did everything in his power to assist the men in his command He lived only six weeks in Nova Scotia before a putrid sore throat (Diphtheria) carried him away. When spring came, only half of the three hundred were willing to settle in Nova Scotia.

So this is how Nathan Pushie came to Nova Scotia and settled at the West River in Antigonish. Like his grandfather before him, Nathan was starting on virgin land by clearing woods and breaking Antigonish soil. The Napoleonic Wars brought a demand for timber in Britain and Antigonish flourished because it was at the junction of two river down which timber could be floated. Pushee erected a sawmill and sold it in 1818 to his son Henry and John G. Peabody. Except the White Pine which was reserved for use as masts and spars in the Royal British Navy and all mines of gold, silver, copper, lead and coals. The ones that stayed were bound to pay a yearly rent of two shillings for every one hundred acres; within three years the grantee must clear three acres in every fifty acres of clearable land .. or clean/drain three acres of swamps/sunken ground or marsh. Where the the land was accounted barren, the grantee must place upon it three meat cattle, erect a good dwelling house of at least twenty feet in length x sixteen feet in breadth. On stony ground not fit for pasture or planting, within three years the grantee was expected to dig a stone quarry. The failure to full fill these requirements would void the land grant.

AND finally, to force a bitter pill for the former American rebels to swallow, every grantee had to take an oath of allegiance which would forever dispel any hopes they may have had to return to their homeland...

"I do promise and declare that I will maintain and defend to the utmost of my power the authority of the King in His Parliament as the Supreme Legislature of this Province. 1785 "

Two whose extraordinary careers in both General George Washington's and King George's armies and a pair of Loyalist brothers endowed their adopted country with a numerous and steady lines of descendants. Nathan's homestead was between Antigonish Village and the West River near where the railroad now passes. It was a beautiful spot with it's green fields and lovely trees which later became the town of Antigonish. His clearing bordered the south side of the West river and where the river was bridged at St. Andrew's street, the first structure was known as Pushee's Bridge.

As an earnest of their intentions, one Sergeant Major Miles prepared a petition for submission to the authorities in London, to acquaint the latter with the men's needs for wives. We are nearly three hundred in number and all willing to become useful members of the community. Neither Pushie or Williams awaited unseen brides from the old country. Williams found a wife in Truro, Anne (Jane) daughter of George Scott in 1788.

Nathan married Jane Porter (nee Brown), born about 1760, a native of Ireland on April 20'th of 1787. They had a family of seven - five sons - William, Thomas, George, John, David and two daughters, Johanna and Sarah. Jane was a widow and she was a remarkable woman of character and physical strength.

By record Nathan Pushee was a strong and courageous man, eg: when capital crime shocked the law-abiding citizens of the community, Pushee was chosen to escort an accused murderer to Halifax. No one was willing to witness against the accused of the shooting so McGrath was released. For the trouble McGrath had given, the neighbours seized his cattle. Nathan was also a religious man and was involved in the modest beginnings in 1804 to start a church, the St. James Presbyterian, later United, Church of Antigonish. And even though Zephaniah Williams, Nathan Pushee and their wives worshipped in St. James Church from its inception, their names are not recorded in the St. James cemetery interment list 1804-1864. Where they were buried is not known, but the list does include numerous children and grandchildren's names. Considered by some as the founder of Antigonish, in the census of 1827 he was listed as a farmer with 35 acres under cultivation, 18 horned cattle, 30 sheep and 6 pigs. Pushee served as an officer in the local militia and as a school trustee.

In 1838 a more lenient act of the American Congress and newspaper publicity about a fellow soldier suggested to Pushee that he apply for a pension as an American soldier.

After many years Captain Nathan Pushee, at the age of 80 years, returned to the United States to claim a back pension awaiting him of \$1,056.00. Pushee considered it diplomatic not to mention his post-Continental Army career with King George's Duke of Cumberland Regiment. He was warmly welcomed and was banqueted in honour of the service he had rendered to his country.

Nathan heard of an ex-comrade, Captain Jesse Smith with whom he served in Col. William Washington's cavalry detachment that had supplied guard for the General George Washington. The two had not see each other for fifty-nine years. The visit coincided with a rally in Salem of the 1812 War veterans and Captain Smith and Trumpet-Major Nathan Pushee were made much off. From Salem, Nathan stopped to visit with old friends at Newport. There the excitement and strain of travel brought on a fatal heart attack. His remains were re buried in 1874 to Antigonish, NS

Jane Pushee lived an unusually long life. Her obituary in The Casket, May 19, 1853 gave her age at near of 105 years. The American Government Pension Records show her having been born in 1760 means she would've died at the age of 93. She was the first white woman who came to Antigonish. She was through life proverbial for her generosity and kindness. She aided the poor, suffering, the expecting and the sick. When the country was without roads and the great depth of snow seemed to offer insurmountable travelling difficulties, she would be found travelling on snowshoes to minister the needy. She had been known to give the clothes off her own back. Mrs. Pushee in 1852 applied for an advanced-age pension, fourteen years into her widowhood, it too was granted in May of that year at the rate of \$132.00 annually and was retroactive five years. It is a sad coincidence that Jane only got to enjoy it for one year.

Friday, June 3, 1853

Antigonish NS, May 5, 1853, saw the passing of Jane, 105, relict late Nathan Pushee, who was trumpet Major in the staff of General Washington in the revolutionary War; and who died at Onslow on his return from the US in 1833, after having been admitted a Revolutionary Pensioner and having received back pay for a number of years. The deceased was the first white woman who came to that part of the county of Sydney, having settled there in 1784. Her descendants number 147, being 10 children, 10 grandchildren, 67 great grand children.

Jane lived to be a very old age and is still remembered in Antigonish for her many kind and helpful deeds.




Fig Number range Fig_Tree of Edward Piper of Gunters Farm, Wimbish



AND

Richard Pace I and Isabella Smythe were married in the same church where Bishop Richard Pace was buried (at the southside near the great altar)



NOTE: William Pace, a cousin of Sarah Pace Biswanger was a Patriot. He was part of the Commander-in-Chief's Guards in 1777.

Nathan Pushee, gr grandfather of Jane Pushie Biswanger (Joseph's wife) was also part of the Life Guard of General George Washington in March, 1776. William and Nathan were both in the battles of Brandywine, Germantown and Monmouth. Musician - trumpeter

Walter S. Pushie, 32'nd Regiemnt, North Carolina Infantry, Lenoir Braves, company rant, CDG Musician
Nathan was captured by the British in 1780. William Pace and Walter Pushie got to go home.
Nathan Pace had to sail on the Argo to Nova Scotia. Many didn't survive this voyage.

Nathaniel Pushie arrived the same year as the Pace family did to Nova Scotia. Unfortunately for Nathaniel, he got a ride on the Argo. In June of 1784 the first ship, the Argo started the evacuation the "Empire Loyalists" as they became known as, from Florida to Halifax, arriving on July 13, 1784. The Argo's sail was brutal arriving in poor condition to sickness and stormy weather. Followed by the Tartar, The Sporing and possibly the Cyrus up into the following year. from St. Augustine, Florida; Charleston, South Carolina and Savannah, Georgia.

America's Grandfather of Pace's Paines, Virginia in 1622

Listen my children, come face to face
with your brave gr. grandfather Richard Pace.
He lived in England four centuries past.
He finished Cambridge the best in his class.
He Grandpapa John finished Cambridge & Eton too
like Father John he did best what he had to do.
One was *Secretary* for King Henry the Eighth
Our beloved counsellor Master Richard Pace
One was Royal Jester for Queen Elizabeth, the First .
You see, your ancestors had noble birth.

When Richard learned the Admiral of the ocean sea
Discovered America for you and me,
He asked the *King* for a farm on Virginia's shore.
He granted his wish and a little bit more:
Two hundred acres on the Jamestown River
Where savages fought with bow and quiver.
He asked him to take his wife Isabella Smythe
And little son George to build a new life.
He needed a brave soldier for wilderness works
to protect his colony in Virginia's woods.

Pace cut down the forests and planted corn;
he began his work each early morn.
He caught fish in the river from a dugout canoe;
He finished the work he had to do.
He built a big home on Mt. Pleasant Bluff;
He saved his earnings until he had enough
To return his son to an English school,
A court education was his father's goal.

When the Marmaduke sailed with little George,
Loneliness began on Pace's Paines Gorge.
To fill the gap the Paces found an Indian lad,
Chanco by name who had lost his Dad.
Chanco was taught to read and write,
To plant the crops and care for the stock.
A grateful foster son this Indian Chanco,
He taught Colonel Pace to plant tobacco.
The money rolled in from this smoking weed,
It paid plantation debts with joyful speed.
The James town colonials could see the stars
When Europe smoked more Raleigh cigars.
Prosperity in Virginia replaced "starvin' time".
Uprising Indians began to combine
to plot, to destroy

These pale face invaders, swapping land for a toy.

Upon the death of friendly Chief Powatan,
His brother the treacherous Chief Opechcan
Ordered the Indian braves to destroy every man,
his squaw and every child in his colony clan.
Chanco's job was the Chief's command.
The murder of Father Pace on the ides of March,

Pace quickly ran into Pastor Maycock's cabin,

were the corpses of Reverend Sam and his Wife.
Alas ! no other sign of surviving life.
A tear rolled down his cheek when he discovered
Baby Sarah's cradle was empty without cover.

Pace fearfully circled the house and farm;
He searched the well, the garden, the barn.
A frightened mother cat on a pile of limbs
Disappeared within *that* frighten him.
Her cries directed him to remove the limbs
Covering an open grave - on a quilt of silk
Lay a four month baby clutching a bottle of milk.
Little Sarah was saved as he lifted her up -
her crackers, her milk and her silver cup
Mother Pace would finish the job
Farsightedly begun by the Maycocks and God.
As he warmed little Sarah inside his coat,
How could he know she would marry son George?
She at 15 and George 21, became parents of his Richard Grandson.
As ancestors of Richards II through IV, now Drury
Then William, Dredzil and Lucrecia's five generations;
Richard Pace's 5000 descendants helped build a new nation.

As a target of the wrath of Indian revenge,
When the colonials in battle, while their home did singe,
Richard Pace had a fatal arrow delivered into him.
