# Report of the Public Archives of Nova Scotia

## FOR THE YEAR 1935.

To The Board of Trustees of the Public Archives of Nova Scotia:

Gentlemen:

In my last report I discussed the general condition of the building and urged the necessity of making it absolutely waterproof. To this end the parapet, cornices, windows and doors were thoroughly caulked, and a leak in one of the internal drains discovered and stopped, in the early summer, and the whole experiment put to the proof. The building has resisted the summer rains but must be tested by winter weather before a final report can be made. When this has been done the window-frames and doors should be painted inside and out and the whole interior thoroughly renovated.

During the year the remaining miscellaneous papers on the first floor, amounting to more than four hundred volumes, have been sorted and removed to the manuscript room to be distributed among the various series already there in the process of being catalogued or calendared, and progress has been made in filing the papers of the Supreme Court. Many thousands of these have been arranged and listed but about a dozen boxes remain to be examined.

In the library and the newspaper and manuscript rooms the staff as a whole has been busy assisting regular students or casual enquirers, as well as in organizing, cataloguing and calendaring archival materials to facilitate their use. Several mature students from Canadian and American universities have been using these materials, and in recent books or other publications have expressed their appreciation of the assistance given by this institution and its staff to the cause of historical research. Special mention should be made of the increasing interest in our collection of newspapers which is in constant use, partly because of its accessibility and partly because of the cleaning, repairing, and attractive binding done by Mr. MacLaren, also of the index of the historical articles in the various periodicals that has been prepared by Miss Gilroy.

Having published a catalogue of the Akins' Library and thereby discovered both our strength and our weakness, so far as research is concerned, special attention has been paid recently to our modern library in the hope of completing broken sets and procuring the most useful secondary source materials. Through the courtesy of the Dominion Archives and the Archives of Quebec, Ontario and British Columbia, we now have practically everything published by them, as well as the papers and records published by the Canadian Historical Association, the Ontario Historical Society, the Nova



Scotia Historical Society and the Royal Society of Canada. We also have the Canadian Historical Review, the Journal of Modern History, and the Dalhousie Review, together with a complete set of its two predecessors, the McGill University Magazine and the University Magazine, which, in addition to many articles of an historical nature, offer a useful commentary, from an academic point of view, on Canadian public affairs since the turn of the present century. We are gradually extending our exchange list with other Canadian and eastern American historical societies, and already have a very promising collection.

By watching second-hand catalogues, we have been able to procure the first thirteen volumes of the Celtic Magazine, which contains many articles on the history and people of Scotland that have a direct bearing on the history of Nova Scotia, the first fourteen volumes of Bentley's Miscellany, in which there are original contributions from Howe, Haliburton and Alexander McDougall: and also a complete set of Haliburton's imaginative works in twenty-two volumes, all but two of which are first editions. These, added to the historical works of Haliburton already in the Akins' Library, together with the first edition of "The Clockmaker" published by Howe at Halifax, in 1836, make a very creditable collection of Haliburton's works. In the same way we have added to our research library such rare books as Lord Sheffield's "Observations on the Commerce of the American States" (1787), and Knox's "Extra Official State Papers" (1789), along with more modern books bearing upon Nova Scotian history or literature. These examples indicate to some extent the work that is being done and the policy that is being pursued.

The librarian reports that three hundred and eighty-six students and other researchers have used our collections and that they have consulted one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine secondary sources and one thousand three hundred and forty-eight manuscript volumes. Since no books or manuscripts are permitted to be taken from the building and the majority of those using them are serious students, who work for several days or weeks at a time and keep their materials on their own tables until they have finished with them, the number of volumes used seems smaller than it actually is. The same is true of the number of students, as they are counted only on arrival and at the beginning of each month. But as we are less concerned with numbers than with the intelligent use of our specialized library and manuscript room, the present system commends itself as saving the time of both the students and the librarian. Apart from students and researchers, six hundred and fifty-nine people have visited the library individually or in groups.

Since my last report the following articles have appeared in various periodicals embodying the results of research by members of the staff:—Marion Gilroy, **Correspondence re the Partition of Nova Scotia and Customs Fees in Nova Scotia**. The Canadian Historical Review; Margaret Ells, **The Dartmouth Whalers and Loyalist Attitudes**, The Dalhousie Review; D. C. Harvey,



**Early Public Libraries in Nova Scotia**, The Dalhousie Review, **Educational Experiments in Nova Scotia**, **Struggling towards an Educational System**, and **Educational Activities in Cape Breton**, The Journal of Education, also **Holland's Description of Cape Breton Island and Other Documents**, Publication number two of the Public Archives of Nova Scotia.

During the present academic session five graduate students are investigating the following subjects under my direction: **The Origin and Social Organization of the Acadians**, **Communications in Nova Scotia 1749-1815**, and also from **1815-1850**, **Early Literature in Nova Scotia**, and **Education in Nova Scotia 1840-65**. The results of this research will be filed in the Archives for future reference until arrangements can be made for publishing such extracts as make a contribution to existing knowledge.

It is unnecessary to add that in addition to preserving the records of Nova Scotia's colourful history, our chief duty is to organize these records and to transmute them into written history as fully and rapidly as possible.

As a member of the Historic Sites and Monuments Board of Canada, I am endeavouring also to have some of the more significant facts of our history recorded in stone and bronze. During the year three memorials have been erected in Nova Scotia, two of which have been unveiled with appropriate ceremonies, the first, marking the birth-place of Simon Newcomb, at Wallace Bridge, and the second, commemorating the first agricultural fair in Canada, at Windsor. Consideration of the relative importance of such memorials as are projected, and arrangements for the unveiling of such memorials as are erected, require much thought and occupy much time, but it seems fitting that such work should be centred in this building, which is devoted entirely to historical uses.

In co-operation with the Canadian Committee of the Carnegie Corporation, which has made a grant for the purpose, the Archives has recently undertaken an experiment in extension work that promises to be very beneficial to the schools and general public of the province. The idea at present is to carry the Archives to those people in Nova Scotia who reside outside of Halifax, and therefore cannot visit the institution or utilize its resources without considerable effort and expense. It is hoped that as their interest is thus aroused and their needs made manifest, more of the teachers and others engaged in educational work will make full use of our collections in future years. To this end, Dr. J. S. Martell, who rejoined our staff on his return from London in September, has been visiting the high schools throughout the province, describing and illustrating the Archives and its work. He has also been broadcasting a series of lectures on Nova Scotian history in the weekly programme offered on Friday afternoons by the Department of Education. As the project unfolds further activities will be undertaken.

The people of Nova Scotia past and present continue to show their interest in the Archives through donation or bequest. The late William Harrison, who died in Wolfville, N. S., bequeathed a



number of books, magazines and documents relating to Nova Scotia, and the late Mrs. Euphemia Ross of Truro, and her daughter, the late Mrs. A. J. White of Halifax, a number of books, pictures, and the "Royal Chair" made by Mrs. Ross's father, James Thomson, on the occasion of the visit of the Prince of Wales in 1860. Through the good offices of Senator E. N. Rhodes, a marble bust of Sir John Thompson, sculptured by Hebert, was presented by Col. John Thompson of Ottawa. Another outstanding gift of the year is a copy in oils of the standard portrait of Bishop Inglis painted by John C. Miles and presented by his daughter-in-law, Mrs. Josephine Miles of Pawtucket, R. I. Mention should also be made of the transfer of the colours of the 25th and 85th Battalions from Province House to the custody of the Archives on July 17th. A list of donations will be found in Appendix A of this report.

Following the practice of previous years I am publishing lists of some of the earlier settlers. Appendix B contains a list of 1313 German, Swiss, and French settlers who were transferred to Lunenburg from Halifax in 1753 and were still receiving assistance in 1757. Appendix C contains a list of the immigrants from Yorkshire in the spring and early summer of 1774.

A statement of receipts and expenditures for the past eleven months will be found below.

## APPENDIX B.

Part of the plan for the effective occupation of Nova Scotia, after the Peace of Aix-la-Chapelle and the restoration of Louisbourg to France, was the founding of Halifax and the distribution of Foreign Protestants amongst the Acadian settlements. To this end about two thousand five hundred German, Swiss and French Protestants were attracted to Halifax between 1749 and 1753. Records for 1753 are not available; but volume 28 of the Public Archives of Nova Scotia reports the arrival of ten vessels from Rotterdam, between 1750 and 1752, with two thousand two hundred and thirty German, Swiss and French immigrants on board.

The initiative of the French at Chignecto and the fear of Indian hostility led the British officials to give up the plan of settling these immigrants amongst the Acadians, and to plant them nearer Halifax. Hence the founding of Lunenburg. On May 28, 1753, one thousand four hundred and fifty-three settlers, ninety-two regular troops and sixty-six rangers embarked at Halifax and arrived at Lunenburg on June 7th. The names of those who embarked for Lunenburg are not in the Archives, but there is preserved a list of those who were victualled there in 1757 to the number of one thousand three hundred and thirteen. As these were the ancestors of most of the inhabitants of Lunenburg county they are printed below.

## APPENDIX C

Michael Francklin had visited England in the winter of 1772; and during the next five years inclusive there was a considerable influx of farmers and laborers from Yorkshire to Nova Scotia, amounting in all to about seven hundred persons. The Archives has no list of those who arrived prior to April 1774 or subsequent to July of that year, nor has it the passenger lists of any of the immigrant ships. But in Volume XV of the Collections of the Nova Scotia Historical Society Pp. 41 ff. there is a passenger list of the **Albion** mentioned below, giving the names, occupations, and reasons for emigrating, of one hundred and eighty-seven persons; also, the passenger list of the ship **Jenny**, which arrived in April 1775 with seventy-nine passengers on board.

This immigration is interesting not only for its own sake but also because it reveals the objections of the British government at that time to the emigration of its own people. On May 10, 1774, Governor Legge wrote Lord Dartmouth, "Within these few days two Brigantines have arrived in this Harbour from Hull, importing two hundred and eighty persons from Yorkshire. And I am well informed that three vessels more are to come from the same place: and that the whole of the numbers will amount to upwards of six hundred persons. These people, My Lord, do not come here with the expectation of having lands granted to them, some come to purchase, others perhaps to become tenants, and some to labour." (P.A.N.S. Vol. 44, doc. 31)

On July 6th he wrote again transmitting the list printed below, with the following comment: "I believe they are all arrived who propose coming this year. As there is no other kind of business carried on in this colony than farming and fishing, their settling with us will be least prejudicial; them that are able are purchasing lands of the former settlers, others hiring themselves out to service, and others, wishing themselves at home again, will soon quit this Province." (P.A.N.S. Vol. 44, doc. 37).

On the same date Lord Dartmouth wrote Governor Legge as follows: "The increase of Inhabitants in the Province of Nova Scotia, by emigration from this Kingdom may be of local Advantage to the Colony, but is a Circumstance of very alarming Consequence and Consideration, in respect to the Interests and Security of Great Britain; and as it is an evil that must soon require some remedy, you will do well to order an exact Account to be taken and transmitted to me, from time to time, of the Number of Persons coming into the Province, either from hence or from Ireland." (P.A.N.S. Vol. 32, doc. 22).

Legge replied on September 13th promising to keep Dartmouth informed, but doubting whether there would be much more to report. "They are", he wrote, "few in comparison to those gone to the other colonies, and I am of opinion that, hereafter, very few will come here, as they seem to be not well pleased with the country; the best



lands are already granted the rest being wilderness land; those people have returned home who were dissatisfied or were not able to purchase of the former inhabitants." (P.A.N.S. Vol. 44, doc. 44).

No more is heard of Yorkshire immigration until June 27, 1776, when General Massey makes the following report with evident satisfaction: "As I had application made to me from some Yorkshire families to leave this Province and return home, who seem'd Heartily sick of their jaunt, I thought it might have a proper Effect at home, to prevent the old Country from losing so many of her subjects, I have therefore given some their passage to England and others to Ireland, if this step meets your Lordship's approbation, I shall be happy."
