- Q.Did you give this jacket to anybody last week
 A. Yes, I gave it to Donald Marshall Jr. on the night of
 the 27th of May 1971 at Bedford, N.S. and he continued
 to wear it from there on.
- A. We stayed in Bedford that light. We were going to a meeting In Shubenacadie the next morning
- A. Friday night 9:30 P.M. account arrived home on the 28th of May
- Q. Where did you let Donald off at
- A. From my residence then to his own
- Q. Did he have your jacket at that time
- A. Yes
- Q. Did you see him after that that night
- A. No. Not that night I did not see him till either Saturday afternoon or evening
- Q. Where did you get the jacket from later
- A. I got his father to bring it to me on June 2nd and I gave it to Det. M.R.McDonald
- Q. was the jacket in good shape when you gave it to him
- A. Yes it was
- Q. Was it ripped or cut on the sleeve

ROY GOULD, being called and duly sworn, testified as follows: BY MR. MacNEIL: (Dir. Exam.)

- Q. What is your full name, sir?
- A. Roy Gould.
- Q. Where do you live?
- A. 124 Membertou Street.
- Q. That's in the City of Sydney, County of Cape Breton, Province of Nova Scotia?
- (10) A. Yes.
 - Q. And do you know the accused in this case, Mr. Donald Marshall?
 - A. I do.
 - Q. And were you in his company on the 27th day of May, 1971?
 - A. Was that a Priday?
 - Q. I don't know. I'll have to have a look. Thursday.
 - A. Yes, I was.
 - Q. And where were you with him?
 - A. We were at Bedford in Shubenacadie.
 - Q. And at that time did you own any clothing that you weren't
- (20) wearing?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. What?
 - A. A jacket.
 - Q. Describe the jacket, please.
 - A. A yellow jacket with white stripes.
 - Q. And what did you do with this jacket?
 - A. I loaned it to Donald Marshall.
 - Q. And what was the condition of this jacket when you loaned it to him?
 - (30) A. Good.
 - Q. I'll show you exhibit 3. Will you tell me what that is, please?
 - A. That's the jacket I leaned to Mr. Marghall.
 - Q. Would you look at the condition of the jacket at the present time
 - A. Yes.

- 50 ROY GOULD, Dir. Exam.
 - Q. Was it in that condition when you loaned it to Mr. the accused, Donald Marshall, Jr.?
 - A. No.
 - Q. What is the difference in its appearance today and when you loaned it to him?
 - A. This wasn't here, the cut-
 - Q. You're saying this wasn't here what do you mean by "this is not here"?
- (10) A. It wasn't in that condition.
 - Q. What?
 - A. The tear.
 - Q. The tear on the sleeve of the jacket-
 - A. There was no tear on the sleeve in other words.
 - Q. What about the front of the jacket?
 - A. There was no blood stains on it either.
 - Q. And tell me, you loaned this jacket to Donald Marshall when you were in Shubenacadie?
 - A. Yes.
- (20) Q. And when did you return from Shubenacadie or did you return from Shubenacadie with the accused?
 - A. Yes, on Priday evening.
 - Q. Friday evening, that is, 27th of May-
 - A. 28th.
 - Q. 28th, I'm sorry. The 26th of May, 1971?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. Friday I'm sorry, sir. I apologize for confusing you.
 You returned to where?
 - A. Returned to Membertou.
- (30) Q. And who else was with you?
 - A. Just Mr. Marshall.
 - Q. And what time did you return?
 - A. Approximately 9:30 that evening.
 - Q. Did you stay with Mr. Marshall?
 - A. No, he went to his own residence.

- 51 ROY GOULD, Dir. Exam.
 - Q. He went to his own home?
 - A. Right.
 - Q. Where was the jacket when he went to his own home?
 - A. He still had it.
 - Q. And did you at a later date recover this jacket?
 - A. Yes. About, Wednesday or Thursday of the following week.
 - Q. Where did you go for it?
 - A. I obtained it from his father, Donald Marshall, Sr. I asked
 - him to bring it over upon request of the City Police. (10)
 - Q. Did you get the jacket from Donald Marshall Sr.?
 - A. Yes, I did.
 - Q. What did you do with it?
 - A. Turned it over to Sgt. MacDonald.
 - Q. Sgt. Michael MacDonald?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. City of Sydney Police Force?
 - A. Yes.

ROY GOULD called, duly sworn, testified:

DIRECT EXAMINATION

MR. EDWARDS: Sir, you are Roy Gould?

- Yes, I am. Α.
- What is your address, Mr. Gould? 0.
- Presently residing at 3 Millard Street in A. Sydney.
 - Mr. Gould, where did you reside in 1971? 0.
 - 124 Membertou Street, the same Membertou A.
- Reserve. 10.
 - At that time did you know Donald Marshall, Jr.? Q.
 - Yes, I did. Α.
 - Did you know Donald Marshall, Sr.? Q.
 - Yes, I did. A.
- Now on the day of May 28th, 1971, the day of 0. the incident in question, do you recall where you were 15. that day?
 - We were just returning from Bedford, Nova Α. Arriving in Sydney about 9:30 that evening. Scotia.
 - Yes. Now who returned to Sydney from Bedford, Nova Scotia with you?
 - Donald Marshall, Junior. A.
 - Okay. And where did you stop off in Sydney? Q.
 - I took him back to the Reserve and I left him · A . there.
- Now what was Donald Marshall wearing when you Q. 25. left?
 - He left with my jacket which was a yellow jacket with white stripes.
 - A yellow jacket with white stripes. And what condition was the jacket in when you lent it to him that evening?

- MR. GOULD, Direct Examination
- A. It was fairly new. It was in perfect condition.
- Q. Okay. When did you next see that jacket, Mr. Gould?
- A. About mid-week of that same week, the following week rather.
 - Q. And where did you see it?
- A. Well, I obtained the jacket from Mr. Donald Marshall, Senior at the request of the City Police.

THE COURT: I'm sorry, I missed that. What was
that?

10. A. I took it from Donald Marshall, Senior. At the request of City Police.

MR. EDWARDS: And what was the condition of the jacket at that time?

- A. There was a rip on one of the sleeves and there was blood stains on it.
 - O. What appeared to be blood stains.
 - A. Um-hmm.
 - Q. What did you do with the jacket then?
- A. I turned it over to Michael MacDonald, a detective at the time with the Sydney City Police.
- Q. Did you see the jacket or get the jacket back after that?
 - A. No.
 - Q. Thank you very much, Mr. Gould. No further questions. My learned friend may have some questions.

CROSS-EXAMINATION

- 25. MR. WINTERMANS: Mr. Gould, going back to the day that you returned from Bedford, Nova Scotia with Donald Marshall, Jr. you say you arrived back at 9:30 that day?
 - A. It was around 9:30 in the evening.
- Q. In the evening. 9:30 p.m. And you say you dropped off Donald Jr. at his home, did you?

- MR. GOULD, Cross-Examination
- A. Somewhere around the Reserve. I think I went home myself and he just hopped off the car.
 - Q. Okay. Did you see him later on that night?
- A. Not that evening. The next morning I saw him.
- Q. And do you recall whether or not you went to the liquor store with Donald Jr?
 - A. No.
- Q. That evening at approximately 9:30 when you returned from Bedford, Nova Scotia?
 - A. No, I don't recall.
 - Q. Are you saying that you didn't?
- A. No, I'm not saying I didn't. I just don't remember it.
- Q. So to the best of your recollection you came back from Bedford and went straight home. Or to the Micmac area.
- A. Yeah, well, I went home, probably got dressed and went out again.
 - Q. With Donald Jr. or by yourself?
 - A. By myself.
 - Q. Are you sure of that?
 - A. That was my normal routine on a Friday night.
 - Q. Thank you.

THE COURT: Any re-examination?

MR. EDWARDS: Nothing out of that.
