

Mr. M.D. Mattson, 103 Byng Ave., called the Police Station and reported that he heard some men talking on the street outside his house and from their conversation. it seems someone has been assaulted in wentworth Park and in need of medical attention.

Cars 1 - 3 and 4 responded.

Further to the above Cpl. Martin MacDonald reported two men had been stabbed - one in serious condition and required an ambulance. T.W.Curry's were notified and responded; also Det. M.R.MacDonald who took over the investigation.

On arrival, noticed Sandy Seale of Westmount on the ground: after apparently being felled by stab woundsinflicted apparently from a person or persons who had fled the scene. Seale's intestines were visible and a considerable amount of blood had been lost as a result of the stabbing. The family were notified. A companion. Donald Marshall also treated and released.

Received a call from Sgt. MacGillivray that Mr. Mattson, 106 Byng Ave., called and said he thought someone was stubbed in the park. At this time. I was on the parking lot at St. Joseph's Hall where a dance was taking place.

We proceeded to Byng Ave. at a fast speed and not seeing anyone around at 105 kept going towards the Esplanade and at this time, received a call from the Station that they went over behind the Drug Store, Polletts, Corner of George and Argyle St. I turned around at Byng and Charlotte and sped towards the Drug Store and went in behind the building but could not see anyone around this area.

We, Cpl. M. McDonald, then turned of Argyle unto Crescent St. and checking along the grass and at this time up ahead of me, I could see someone standing in the middle of the road waving his hands to come on. On arrival Jr. Marshall was standing on the road waving his hands and a fellow laying on the memerant. I jumped out of the car and Marshall said he and his buddy, Sandy Seale were stabbed.

I checked Seale briefly and then called for an ambulance at which time Const. Walsh and Mros in Car # 8 came in off Bentinck St. Marshall told me it was a tall follow with white hair and a short follow. He showed me the knife wound on his left arm so I said to Const. Walsh, I will take Marshall to the hospital and I left immediately for the City Hospital.

We were on George St. near Shandwick St. when we seen this boy who seemed nervous and was carrying shirt in his hand. When we stopped the car he came over and asked for a drive to Louisburg. We asked him what was wrong and he in turn asked if we knew of a stabbing in the park and he stated he had seen what happened. The shirt he was carrying had blood on it and he was wearing only his jacket. He was put in the police car and taken to Det. M.R.MacDonald who was at City Hospital. After being questioned, by Det. M.R.MacDonald, he was taken to station where he called his father to come to Sydney to pick him up.

At this time as a result of a Police Call to the vicinity of 103 Byng ave. re a stabbing, all cars on the town side were dispatched to the area. Curs 1 - 4 - 5. I was in Car # 5 and picked up Cst. Leo Mros and went to the Wentworth Park area.

Cst. Howard Dean and Cpl. Martin MacDonald arrived first at the scene and Cst. Dean radioed that the incident happened on Crescent St. We immediately were on the scene.

Cst. Dean had one Donald Junior Marshall, who had been stabbed in the left arm and told me he would take Marshall to the hospital, and I and Mroz would stand by to wait for an ambulance to convey one Sandy Seale to hospital.

Seals at this time was lying on his left side on the pavement on Crescent St. I approached the youth on the ground and moved his jacket to the extent of his injury and on moving his shirt. I

observed his intestines protruding from the opening in his abdomen. Curry's ambulance responded to the scene and Seale was removed to City Hospital where he wastaken to surgery immediately by Doctor Maavi. The only remark made by Seale other than moans of pain was in the hospital on the table in the outpatient room when he said "I can't breathe" After we left the hospital, Cat. Mros and I went to all open restaurants to check for two suspects described by Donald Marshall. I checked the Wandlyn Motel; Cape Bratoner Motel and the Isle Royal Motel re any parties checking in through the night but to no avail.

Also checked some of the taxis as to whether two men had been taken anywhere. At the scene on Crescent St., I was unable to come up with an eye witness as to what had taken place. Sandy Seale had been at the dance at St. Joseph's and observed there by Cst. John Mullowney.

There were several people on Crescent St. who live where this incident took place who might be able to give something further. At this time we could not leave the street to question these people.


Left dance at 11:45 P.M. - the two of us got the bus for Westmount on the Esplanade. G.Dixon stated he drew a fake stamp on Sandy Seale's hand and on his own; and also on D. Noseworthy -Lester drew his own, or got xomakant somebody else to do it. Sandy was turned away by the Police. Elaine, my sister, got the bus down the road from us. She was alone.

June 1-1971 - Interviewed James Cotie, address - 220 George St.
Sydney, N.S., as a report received from P.C. John
Mullowney was that Cotie was in Wentworth Park and
was also stabbed. Examined Cotie's body and found
burn marks on his back. He indicated to us that he
had fallen down the stairs at his home with the baby
carriage at 220 George St. and this is what happened
to his back. A story which could be true. They were
definitely not stab marks on his back as reported.

May 31, 1971 - Interviewed Keith Beaver in regard to Alanna Dixon's story and the only change that I found in his story was that they were talking with Sandy Seale leaving the dance and that he walked down George St. with them - that Sandy did not enter the Park at that time. He kept on down George by himself. The Dixon girl stated that Sandy walked through the Park in her statement but went over the bank to the railway track.

Statement of Donald John Marshall, age 17 yrs., residing at 38 MicMac St., Sydney -

About 12 P.M., Friday night, I came through the park from the direction of George St. near the tracks. I met Sandy Seale in the park coming towards me. We walked together. We met Bob Patterson. He was drunk. We asked him if he knew us and he called us by name. We told him to sit down. We started to walk to the bridge. We stood there for a few seconds; 2 men whom we did not know called us up from Crescent St. They asked us for 2 cigarettes. I gave them to them; also a book of matches. The old guy started to talk to me about women. I said lots of them in the park; also they wanted to know where a bootlegger was.

I asked them where they were from and they said Manitoba. I asked then if you guys are priests and the tall fellow kmd said we are. One fellow had a long blue coat on. They told us we don't like colored people and Indians. The old guy turned to Sandy and said there is one for you black boy and he put the knife in his stomach. He then took the knife out of Sandy and swung at me and put it in my left arm. He told me there is one for you to Indian.

I stood for 2 seconds and then I ran for help.

They both ran away up back of a green house. I circled around and got help. The police were called and than the ambulance.

Statement of Maynard Vincent Chant - age 15 yrs., residing at Main St. Louisburg. C.B.

Friday night I was in town and I left the bus Terminal on Bentinck St. about 11:40 P.M. I walked down Bentinck St. came over byng ave. and started to cross the tracks. I got half way across the tracks - first I seen 2 fellows walking and 2 more were walking kind of slow talking. The 2 fellows who stabbed Donald Marshall and Sandy Seale - they talked for a few minutes over on Crescent St. One fellow hauled a knife from his pocket and he stabbed one of the fellow - so I took off back across the tracks to Byng Ave. and started to walk towards the bus terminal. Then I seen Donald Marshall coming down. I turned around and started to walk the other way. Donald caught up to me and said look what they did to me. He showed me a long cut on his left arm. Then he said help me - my Buddy is over on the other sid of the park with a knife in his stomach. Then we started to look for more help. We met some boys and girls - one of the girls gave Donald a handkerchief - we got a car to take us over to where Seale was lying on the pavement. I took my shirt and put it around his waist and Donald went to a grey house and asked the man if he would call an ambulance.

About ten minutes later, I went up and asked the man in the house call again and I knelt down beside Sandy Seale and he said it was I unbuttoned his jacket. I then discovered his stomach was I took my shirt and put it where the cut was and made him hot. Then the police arrived. They called for the ambulance. He was taken to the hospital.

They wanted me to walk through with them. I said no. I went down Argyle St. and went over Crescent St. I was over by the Court house when I heard a scream. I looked. I seen S fellows running from the direction of the screaming. They jumped into a white volkswagon; blue lic. and white no. on it. One had a brown cordroy jacket - 5.5 dark complexion; heavy set. The other grey suit about 6 ft. tall; busky; red sweater - like a pullover. I started to run home.

Beaver went home. Karen stayed with me until the bus came.

Statement of Francis Joseph French, 24 Cross St., Sydney, N.S. B. Feb. 28th, 1954.

On Friday night, May 28, 1971, we went down in a car - 63 Ford. We were sitting around telking. Mr. Gary Tobin, Junior Marshall and Ardy Paul, then some one said lets go to the dance.--At St. Joseph's, Gary had to go in to Keltic Tevern to get someone. He went in to get him. He was in for quite awhile. So I asked Jr. if he would go in and get Gary. Jr. came out and said Gary was not in the Tevern.

Jr. went back in again and Gary came out. I said Junior was still in. Gary looked in the Tavern for Jr. again and couldn't find him. Me and Moose went up to the dance. We did not go in the dance as it was packed. We stood outside talking. And this car went by and hollered at us. We said drop dead. The car stopped - a fellow -white-got out of the car; broke a glass and said come on. Moose said drop the glass and I will fight you. The police came over and hollered. The guy got in the car and left. It was a Ford Station Wagon.

At around 12 P.M. we left the dance - walked down George St. Saw the police car with Jr. Marshall in the back and saw another police car and ambulance go up to the hospital. Then I went home.

I was at St. Joseph's Dance Hall last Friday night. I was with Debbie McPherson, Keltic Drive and left the hall about 11:45 P.M. because she wanted to get the North Sydney bus home. We walked down to Wentworth Park. We were there for 5 to 10 minutes; so we walked up on to Crescent St. She noticed Sandy Seale lying down on the roadside. I went over. I noticed it was Sundy and I asked him what was the matter. He told me he was stabled and he needed help. I told her to go get a bus and I ran and tried to find a person to help me. I paid little attention until I heard someone say, "there's someone oleeding in the park". I went to the window, but couldn't see anyone. They were below the verandah and also I had turned off the outside light before going upstairs.

Date of stabbing was May 28, 1971. There was no plea taken in this case as yet and if the Crown is prepared to go ahead with the case, the Preliminary Hearing will be on Monday. Dear Judge O'Connell:

I saw the above mentioned, Mr. Roy Ebsary, at the request of the court on Monday, March 22nd, 1982. I had a rather long conversation with Mr. Ebsary, who in many ways is a rather charming old gentleman.

However, the offense with which he is charged is serious indeed and so I should concern myself with his fitness to plead and question of diminished criminal responsibility in this case. In view of the seriousness of the charge, I feel under a strong obligation to recommend to the court that Mr. Ebsary be referred to the Nova Scotia Hospital on a 30-day Warrant of Remand to establish not only his fitness to plead but also the question of diminished criminal responsibility.

Obviously, Mr. Ebsary is eccentric. I have no way of really knowing whether, in fact, most of the story he tells me about his past are true or untrue; whether, in fact, he was a "gun captain" in the British Navy or Royal Navy or whether, in fact, he is the possessor of a distinguished service medal, which he said was given to him personally by the late Sir Winston Churchill, or the Croix de Guerre apparently given by the late General DeGaulle. He also tells me that he was present at the sinking of the Bismark and so on.

Amongst other things, Mr. Ebsary claims to have written eight books, all on bibical matters, and tells me one is now in its third printing. In general, I find his story quite bizzare but I also found him vague, somewhat deficient in recent memory, rather unsteady on his feet and with a tendency to fainting when he bends down.

For several years he has been under the close medical supervision of Dr. Peter Cardew, who is, unfortunately, no longer a resident in this area.

I would therefore suggest, your Honor, that a copy of this letter be sent to the Psychiatric Forensic Unit, Nova Scotia Hospital so that certain tests could be done on Mr. Ebsary particularly, I think, a EEG under revealing conditions and a CAT Scan, if they feel this necessary.

## RE: EBSARY, Roy Newman

The above-named individual was remanded to this Hospital by order of Magistrate Charles O'Connell of Sydney, N.S., dated the 30th day of March, 1982, for a 30 day period of observation pursuant to Section 543.2 1 of the Criminal Code of Canada.

We have examined this individual and conducted the necessary investigations.

Roy is a 70 year old separated male who was born and brought up at St. John's Newfoundland as the oldest of 12 children in the family (three boys and nine girls). His father was a seaman and a chief steward on a passenger liner. The mother was a housewife. Roy states that he was reared by his maternal grandmother. The grandmother's own son (Roy's uncle Samuel) had been killed in World War I and she adopted Roy as a substitute. Roy states that she gave him everything that he needed or wanted and he had a very happy childhood. About two years ago Roy's 'father' Albert called him and told him that he, Roy, was actually fathered by his uncle, Samuel. Albert died shortly after telling Roy about this. The mother had died a year before that.

Roy has a high school education. After completing high school he worked as a machine operator with a lumber company for eight years. Then he joined the Merchant Marine. He was in the Merchant Navy for approximately 20 years. He claims that he started as an apprentice seaman and achieved the position of captain or chief engineer. He also claims that during the war years he was in the Royal Navy and that he saw

action in the Atlantic as well as the Pacific Ocean. Many of these claims reflect a streak of grandiosity and are contradicted by objective accounts available to us. According to his wife he was never more than an assistant cook in the Navy. Following his marine career Roy worked as a cook at the Isle Royal Hotel. He has not been employed since 1959. He claims that he has spent most of his time since 1959 writing books. Again there is no objective evidence to support this claim which appears to be a figment of his grandiose mind

Roy lived with his wife in a common-law relationship for many years before finally marrying her.

Mrs. Ebsary had four children from a previous union and had two more children from Roy, a boy 27 and a girl, 22. The girl resides in Boston and the boy is living in the Sydney area.

Roy's wife describes him as a self-centered grandiose person who had a serious drinking problem since his teenage years. He was violent towards her as well as the children especially when he was drunk. She states that after the birth of their daughter their relationship deteriorated markedly. He started bringing home younger men and was angry when she questioned him about his relationship with them. She caught him in bed with these young men on a number of occasions but was afraid to confront him because of fear of reprisals. She eventually separated from him two years ago. Roy claims that even after their separation he maintained a friendly relationship with his wife but this assertion is disputed by the latter.

After the separation from his wife Roy moved to an apartment where he apparently indulged in his fondness for drinking and entertained similarly inclined friends.

Roy is known as an eccentric old man in the community. He is said to have decorated his room like a ship. He tells everybody that he was a gunnery captain in the Royal Mavy and was present at the sinking of "Bismark". He also claims that he was decorated personally by Winston Churchill and Charles De Gaulle and he has a number of war medals to support this claims. It is believed that these medals were bought in a pawn shop.

On examination, Roy presented as a white-haired male with a triangular, grey beard and a mustache. He wore black rimmed glasses which were patched up with adhesive tape. His hair was dishevelled. At the time of admission he was in considerable physical distress complaining of pain in

his stomach and other parts of his body. He was slow in answering questions and sometimes groped in his memory for long periods before answering them. His speech was coherent and well organized. However, as mentioned above, it was full of references to his accomplishments in the Royal Navy and in his writing career

Roy was able to give a reasonably detailed account of the circumstances leading to the alleged offence. He asserted his innocense and stated that he had had a couple of drinks of wine and was sleepy throughout the episode in question.

On being questioned Roy described "metaphysical" experiences in which he saw people that he had known in his past. These were not hallucinatory experiences as Roy believed that other people were capable of experiencing the same or similiar parapsychological phenomena.

Subsequent investigations showed that Roy was suffering from chronic heart disease, chronic obstructive lung disease as well as stomach ulcers. Because of his age and the history of excessive drinking, special attention was paid to his neurological status. A neurological examination was within normal limits. An F E.G. showed minor abnormalities which were consistent with but not diagnostic of Organic Brain Disease. A C.T. scan was done at the Victoria General Hospital on March 31,1982 and this was reported as normal.

Although the above mentioned neurological investigations did not show substantial pathology, clinical observation during the 30 day period showed Poy's sensorium to be intermittently clouded. There were periods when he was lucid but on other occasions he showed disorientation to time as well as place and his memory of very recent events seemed to be grossly impaired. For example, one afternoon he did not remember that he had had a series of X-ray in the morning. His account of the happenings of recent past also varied from day to day. Ifter careful analysis of these observations we came to the conclusion that Roy suffered from significant impairment of his brain functions. This conclusion was supported by psychological test results

In summary, Roy Ebsary is an elderly male who has presented a picture of Chronic Organic Brain Syndrome due

to alcoholism, senile brain disease, the cerebral effects of heart and lung disease or a combination of all these factors. Although Roy has many days when he is completely lucid, his sensorium cannot be reliably predicted to be clear on any given day. We believe that this instability of his mental state renders Roy incapable of giving a consistent account to his Defence Counsel and of following the court proceedings in a rational manner.
